What is a Cookie?

A cookie is a small amount of data generated by a website and saved by your web browser. Its purpose is to remember information about you, commonly, login information for a specific site or search settings on a search website. Approved third parties may also set cookies when you interact with our Site. Third parties include search engines, providers of measurement and analytics services, social media networks, and advertising companies. Third parties use cookies in the process of delivering content, including ads relevant to your interests, to measure the effectiveness of their ads, and to perform services on behalf of us.

What Cookies We Use and How We Use Them

Necessary cookies	These cookies help make the website usable by enabling basic functions

Session cookies	We use session cookies, also known as 'temporary cookies', to help the

	activities for as long as they are on the website. Once the web browser is		
	closed, the cookies are deleted.		
Analytical/Performance Cookies	These cookies collect information about how you use the website. These		
	cookies don't gather information that identifies you, they are anonymous		
	and help to improve how the website works.

How We use Cookies and Other Technologies

We use cookies and other technologies for the following purposes:

- Authentication;
- Security;
- · Save your preferences, features, and services;
- Customized content;

Other Tracking Technologies

Cookies are not the only way to recognize or track visitors to a website. We may use other, similar technologies from time to time, like web beacons (sometimes called "tracking pixels" or "clear gifs"). These are tiny graphics files that contain a unique identifier that enable us to recognize when someone has visited our Site or opened an e-mail including them. This allows us, for example, to monitor the traffic patterns of users from one page within a website to another, to deliver or communicate with cookies, to understand whether you have come to the website from an online advertisement displayed on a third-party website, to improve Site performance, and to measure the success of e-mail marketing campaigns. In many instances, these technologies are reliant on cookies to function properly, and so declining cookies will impair their functioning.

Do Not Track Signals

Some browsers have incorporated "do not track" features to enable users to make privacy and security choices. By using these settings, your browser may send a signal to our Site not to collect tracking information. At this time, the Site does not respond to "do not track" signals, if received.

How to Control Cookies

If you do not want to receive cookies, you can modify your browser so that it notifies you when cookies are sent to it or you can refuse cookies altogether. You can also delete cookies that have already been set. You can manage browser cookies through your browser settings. The 'Help' feature on most browsers will tell you how to prevent your browser from accepting new cookies, how to have the browser notify you when you receive a new cookie, how to block cookies, and when cookies will expire. If you block all cookies on your browser, neither third parties nor we will transfer cookies to your browser. If you do this, however, you may have to manually adjust some preferences every time you visit a site and some features and services may not work.
